B. Water Committee – members of local task force including Acton, AD, local realtors, etc, had a pre-run of the slide show that will be presented at first Hauled Water meeting. DH ran through the synopsis. Major change is that they seem to have dropped off the "and for existing homes" from their proposed ordinance language. "Code compliant" storage tank not defined and needs further specification. Questions about "unspoken" changes, i.e. dialog about "no lookback" needs clarification. Required compliance cost estimates seem exorbitant, burdensome. They seem to be listening. For new construction, they will require disinfection system (UV), and recorded covenant. Not retroactive, as of now. Permit and annual fees not mentioned.

a. Report on CSD community workshop (Mary Johnson). Talked briefly about unresolved boundary issue with Acton. On the East, Davenport Estates will be the boundary. Not the manufacturing area or Blomgren. Community meeting 4/26 poorly attended. 35 people attended, comments. CSD Meeting last night to determine where we go from here: Exclude any applications from "rebuilding from a disaster." We would also like to find out if our purpose phrases protecting equestrian, etc is strong enough to prohibit a developer that wants to prohibit horses and if not, what type of language we would need. Eliminating "vegetation conservation" in favor of new County rules. Home-based business caveat – not more than two FTE persons employed there in addition to the resident occupants (80 hours total). Added in allowing 2 home-based categories prohibited in county code: domestic animal training, recording motion picture video production studio home based businesses. Cargo containers: 1 per 1 acre, 2 for 2 net acres, 3 for 5 net acres, 4 for 10 net acres, and one additional for every 5 net acres of additional land. Commercial vehicles more defined. Also discussed why "no gated communities" was not feasible. Confident we now have a good document. June Council Meeting will be for public comment on amended document.
